BUCKINGHAM NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE



GHAM RHOOD NT PLAN

The Buckingham Neighbourhood Plan was officially submitted to Buckinghamshire Council on 6 December 2024, kicking off its final public consultation, the Regulation 16 Consultation. Hundreds of insightful comments from landowners, developers, residents and community groups were received, and now these will be reviewed by an independent examiner. This examiner will decide whether the plan should move forward to a community referendum. If more than 50% of the votes are in favour, the plan will be officially adopted. What is a Neighbourhood Development

plan? It is a document created by local communities to shape future development, helping it align with the needs and desires of residents, while guiding planning decisions and helping to resist speculative development in their area.

MAY ELECTIONS

Have your say on 1st May! Who will represent you as Town and Shire Councillors?

From 1st March this year, Buckingham Town Council ward boundaries were changed from 4 wards to 2 to better reflect community identity and electoral equality. Highlands and Watchcroft ward is now part of Buckingham North (8 Councillors) and Fisher's Field ward is now part of Buckingham South (9 Councillors).

It was decided by the Local Government Boundary Commission, in May 2023, to reduce the number of Shire Councillors representing Buckingham and surrounding parishes from 6 to 3.

Nominations to stand for one of the 17 Town Councillor or 3 Shire Councillor posts open at 10am on 18th March 2025, and close at

4pm on 2nd April 2025. Nomination papers can be found on the Electoral Commission's website.

Useful reminders:

- Postal vote applications close at 5pm on 14th April 2025.
- Proxy vote applications close at 5pm on 23rd April 2025.
- You must take valid photographic ID with you to vote.
- Check your polling card for your polling station.

EMBRACING SPRING IN BUCKINGHAM: A SEASON OF RENEWAL AND CELEBRATION

The season concludes with the Celebrate Buckingham event on June 21st in Bourton Park, a lively gathering with outdoor entertainment, food, and family fun, marking Midsummer and the official close of the spring season.

Each event embraces the joy of spring, bringing the community together in a season of growth, music, and celebration.



BUCKINGHAM'S NEW CEMETERY AND ALLOTMENTS UPDATE




Exciting progress is happening at Buckingham's new Cemetery and Allotments site off the Tingewick Road roundabout. Thanks to funding from HS2's Community and Environment Fund, the Town Council and volunteers have planted 431 trees and added hedging to improve the area's greenery. This will help boost local wildlife and create a peaceful space for reflection and community use.

Groundwork for the Cemetery is set to begin in Spring 2025, with completion expected by late 2025. It will provide 1,060 burial plots, including areas for traditional lawn plots, as well as family and children's sections. At first, only full burials will be available, with ashes interments continuing at Brackley Road Cemetery. The Town Council's Greenspaces Team has also installed fencing to blend the site with the existing hedgerows. In addition to the cemetery, the site will have 50 allotment plots, each 125m², along with water access and parking for 29 vehicles for the cemetery, plus separate parking for the allotments.

Looking ahead, Phase 2 will be a wildflower meadow that could eventually become part of the cemetery's expansion. The meadow will be full of native flowers, supporting wildlife and offering a peaceful, natural space for visitors.

A management plan will ensure that both the cemetery and allotments are cared for, making these spaces an important part of Buckingham for many years to come. This development will provide a quiet green area and useful amenities for local residents.

Planters outside the Old Town Hall

To enhance the appearance and functionality of our town centre, planters have been installed outside the Old Town Hall. These beautiful displays not only add a touch of colour and charm but also serve an important purpose - the planters act as a gentle deterrent to unnecessary parking in this busy area, making it safer and more accessible for pedestrians. Carefully selected plants ensure the displays look attractive all year round and support local wildlife, including bees and butterflies.

Town Centre Study

A comprehensive town centre study was commissioned to better understand Buckingham's strengths, challenges, and opportunities. The research included surveys with local businesses and residents, capturing their concerns and ideas.

The insights from this study are being used to inform the Buckingham Neighbourhood Development Plan, and to shape future community-focused projects that align with the needs of those who live and work here.

Next steps

With some funding remaining, plans are underway to install a permanent piece of public art, celebrating Buckingham's rich culture and heritage. This captivating feature will warmly greet visitors and residents alike as they explore the town.

We're also refreshing the QR code stickers in shop and business windows, connecting visitors to local businesses and showcasing Buckingham's many offerings. These codes link to the Discover Buckingham website, promoting the town as a vibrant place to shop, dine, and visit.

If you or someone you know has difficulty getting around, Buckingham Shopmobility is here to help. This free service is open to anyone with mobility challenges, whether temporary or permanent, and is not limited to Blue Badge holders. Sponsored by Buckingham Town Council, Buckingham Shopmobility provides electric mobility scooters for free, one-day use to help you shop, sight-see, or explore the town centre. Manual wheelchairs are also available, for reasonably priced short-term hire, which can be folded for easy transport to hospital appointments, events, or local attractions.

Our building is conveniently located in Cornwalls Meadow Car Park with designated parking spaces for Shopmobility users right outside.
